Thank you for praying for us this month! We continue to navigate this beginning season with the church plant, and we are learning a lot about patience. Although some weeks we are the only people in the services, we are happy to say that we have had a few visitors in the past month, including one who has come back a couple of times. Of course we are praying to see an increase in visitors soon, and we are trying several things towards that end.

We have been offering English class and even had an advertisement run on Facebook to reach people in our area. So far that has resulted in many online contacts but only one actual visitor. However, because we gained a lot of followers to our church's page we now have people we can follow up with. Several of these online contacts express an intent to come to English class but so far have not made it. I believe this is partly due to all of the heavy rain and flooding we have had in October. Tegucigalpa has been in the national news a lot for all of the washed-out roads and flooded areas. One Sunday in particular, we had a few people message me on Sunday morning that they were coming to the afternoon English class, but we had a big storm and some bad flooding that afternoon and they wrote to tell me they wouldn't be able to make it. Well, lesson learned: Hurricane season probably isn't the best time to start a church; but here we are.

In other news, our new baby is due any day now so we will probably have one new visitor within the next week. After the birth and some recovery time for Amber we are going to start trying some more variety in our outreach. For example, many missionaries have had great success here in offering to teach English and Bible classes in public schools in Honduras. I would also like to reach out into some of the hospitals in the area. We also have some Christmas outreaches planned that we are excited to start work on soon.

The start of a new church isn't always glamorous, and I want to be faithful and transparent in updating you on how it is going. This month was slow. Thank you for praying with us and for us as we continue onward. We are not discouraged, because we know that God has a people here He wants to reach, and if we are willing He will use us in His time. We are excited to see what the future holds!
